

Exploding Arrow Bolts: Dream

In the Cave

In the early morning of the 19th of May 2106, I found myself in a massive series of caves that I was told were more than 30 miles long. I do not know who I was with but I think there were two other guys with me in the cave. I was underground so I could not see the terrain to identify where this was. My sense is it was in the US somewhere and two places seemed to come to mind which included Arkansas and Arizona. Bats also seem to resident in these caves but I did not see any bats. This suggests the caves had an access to the surface. As we were wandering in the caves, we were collecting material from the caves. I was then told that it was to be made into Urea Sulfate as an explosive. I have heard about Urea Nitrate being used in home-made explosives but not Urea Sulfate so I was puzzled by this.

The event then changed and I found myself in a kind of home shop taking apart a bolt from a 80 pound pistol cross bow and then making a mechanism that would enable the Urea Sulfate to be loaded into the point end of the shaft of the aluminum arrow with a trigger cap added to the point of the arrow that would ignite the explosive in the shaft when hitting a target.

The test in the dream was a completely silent arrow shaft streaming through the air and then hitting a target and then exploding. The sense I had was this would be a preferred stealth weapon for close range targets while still retaining a measure of stealth hidden close by. Since the arrow exploded, the directional origin of the arrow would also remain hidden. This was a stealth offensive weapon that could be easily carried and employed for protection and hunting if required.

Time will tell if this actually develops into something real. Certainly the 80 pound pistol crossbows are to be had for under \$30 and the bolts for less than \$0.30 each. This is much cheaper than most any firearm and is affordable. It is also not controlled by various gun registration laws currently in force as you can buy this weapon through the mail without any proof of identify or age.
