## **Tabernacle in the Wilderness: A Vision**

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In the evening of the 3<sup>rd</sup> of November, 2015, I was in much prayer through the day seeking direction. I was at the Hopi Reservation in Arizona and seeking a means to connect with the native people. I then had a vision of the Tabernacle of David. Yes... the Tabernacle of David and not the Tabernacle of Moses. It was greatly reduced in size from that of Moses and was easily carried in a small truck. The Holy of Holies was not more than 10' by 10' and 10' tall and made of light pipe construction with curtains on all 4 sides.

The furniture of this Tabernacle was more representational and not intended for full use as in the Tabernacle of Moses since no blood sacrifice was to occur. The Gate of Entry was just a pipe arch. The Altar was a small BBQ on legs. The Lavor was a large bowel cradled on a stand. The Table of Shewbread was no more than 2' by 3' with communion elements thereon. The Menorah was about 5' tall with the 7 candles alight in glass votive holders. The Censor was a thurable that was hanging on a hook stand pressed into the ground. When entering into the Holy of Holies through the curtain, the Ark was a box 1.5' by 3' on a portable stand with the two angels on the lid of the box facing each other.

I was then told,

## "You are David the son of David and you are to serve in the Tabernacle of David as a priest of David to my people."

In hearing this, I knew it was the Order of Melchizedek that was meant by the phrase, 'priest of David'. Y'Shua is now the high priest of this most ancient Holy order that began with Adam in the Garden of Eden. About two years ago, I was told by YHWH to "no longer be an Orthodox, or an Episcopalian, or a Catholic or a Franciscan but only be of the Order of Melchizedek." I have since withdrawn from all of these groups. I am now only a Culdee which is the Celtic version of the School of the Prophets and means literally "one who is a friend of God."

I then went to the Holy Scriptures to find references to the Tabernacle of David and the last days. This is what I found.

After this I [Y'Shua] will return, and will build again the tabernacle of David, which is fallen down; and I will build again the ruins thereof, and I will set it up. Acts 15:16


But after I uproot them, I will again have compassion and will bring each of them back to their own inheritance and their own country. Jeremiah 12:15

"In that day I will restore David's fallen shelter [Tabernacle] I will repair its broken walls and restore its ruins-- and will rebuild it as it used to be. Amos 9:11

This Tabernacle of David is definitely planned by YHWH for the last days in the reestablishing of the Tabernacle of David and this as a gathering sign for his people in preparation for a return to the land of Israel. It will continue to exist into the Millennium and as it appears by this vision, we are to begin now as we enter into the time of Jacob's trouble to gather together the faithful of the seed of Jacob for a return to their homeland in Israel.

What was interesting about this Tabernacle is that it did not have the curtains around the holy place where the Table, Menorah and Censor were located. Nor were the Gate, Altar

and Lavor separate from these other pieces just mentioned. Only the Ark had its own place separate from the rest in this Tabernacle of David. The six pieces of furniture were all visually seen and accessible by the masses who wanted to worship YHWH. Only the Holy of Holies still had the curtain and even this was open to the front for access by all who dared enter therein. I say dared since an unrepentant person near the Ark resulted in instant death in the past.



If I am to build an Ark, what am I to put in the Ark I wondered? Certainly the bible. Perhaps Oil and Water for anointing. Perhaps the bread and wine for communion. All of these are the symbols of our covenant with YHWH as made possible by Y'Shua who shed his blood upon the cross.
